Christmas Bird Count, Greensboro, NC December 19, 2015

This year's Christmas Count in Greensboro was held on Saturday, December 19th. The number of species counted was 91, which is two less than our all-time high species count of 93 set just last year. There were an additional 3 species found during the count week. The number of individual birds counted was 12,107, which is about average for our count.

The most unusual bird found on the count was a Black-crowned Night Heron, found by Clarence Mattocks, Lane Oldham and Wallace Sills in the brushy growth along a large pond in an office park near the airport. Other highlights were a Greater Scaup found on Lake Townsend, Rusty Blackbirds found in 2 separate locations, and 2 Kestrels and 70 American Pipits found at the White Street Landfill. We also had a large number of Robins, Grackles, and Red-winged Blackbirds. These birds frequently move out of the area for the winter, and we regularly have Christmas Counts with few or none of these species.

The weather was cold in a month that has otherwise had temperatures well above normal. The morning low was 27 and the high was 45. The month has also been unusually rainy, but fortunately we had no rain on count day, and skies were partly cloudy to sunny. 40 people in 13 parties participated in the count putting in 114.75 party hours. The participants ranged from veterans of many years to folks taking part in their first count.
