As we began the birds were just beginning to sing and be active. Besides our the birds we were looking for there were several species of flowers in bloom and numerous spiders and webs. We were able to get sight and a photo of one of the White-eyed Vireos. Later we got sight of another bird, it was higher up in the canopy and although we were able to establish is was yellow on the underside, we were not initially able to identify it. We were able to get a photo. Later I believe I have identified it as a Female or Non-breeding Male Scarlet Tanager. A little past the 1 mile marker just before the turn around point, we were at an open area with several snags. There we were able to see and hear several Red-headed Woodpeckers. Just past this point in the wooded area we were able to verify by sound a Hooded Warbler. All in all, an excellent Bird Walk.


