Location: Old Bynum Bridge, north of Pittsboro, NC

Temperature: high 50's – 70's

Weather: Initially cloudy, but layer partly cloudy

Target Bird(s), if any: Migrants

Bird List: Canada Goose, Black Vulture, Cooper's Hawk, Bald Eagle, Red-tailed hawk, Belted Kingfisher, Red-bellied Woodpecker, Downy Woodpecker, Northern Flicker, Eastern Phoebe, Blue Jay, American Crow, Carolina Chickadee, Tufted Titmouse, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Golden-crowned Kinglet, Brown Creeper, Carolina Wren, European Starling, Eastern Bluebird, American Robin, Cedar Waxwing, American Goldfinch, White-throated Sparrow, Song Sparrow, Swamp Sparrow, Eastern Towhee, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Northern Cardinal; for a total of **29 species**.

Comments: (such as, notable birds seen, interesting bird or animal behavior, condition of the birding site, participant comments):

Initially the birds were quiet and not moving very much. Gradually, at the temperature warmed up and the sun began to break thru the cloud cover, the birds began to move more frequently. The water level, in the Haw River was not very high as there had not been much rain in recent days, but we were surprised that we did not see any Great Blue Herons, Great Egrets, or Double-crested Cormorants. All in all still a good day.
