

Piedmont Young Birders Walk the Osprey Trail, June 26, 2021

The Piedmont Young Birders got to have our birding walk at the Osprey Trail. It is part of the Mountains-to-Sea Trail and tracks along the southern shore of Lake Townsend between North Church and Yanceyville Streets. The weather was a little overcast, but sunny and not too hot.

We spotted an Osprey at the top of a tower about 10 minutes into our hike, which was very exciting! We also got to view an Osprey nest previously in use. We heard a Common Yellowthroat and learned to identify an Eastern Towhee and a Carolina Wren by song. A few people showed us the new version of the Merlin app and how to ID a bird using just the song/call.

We walked about 1.6 miles and together saw 17 bird species. Overall, it was a great walk, and I'm excited to participate in the next one! Anyone interested should check out the Osprey Trail in the future!
